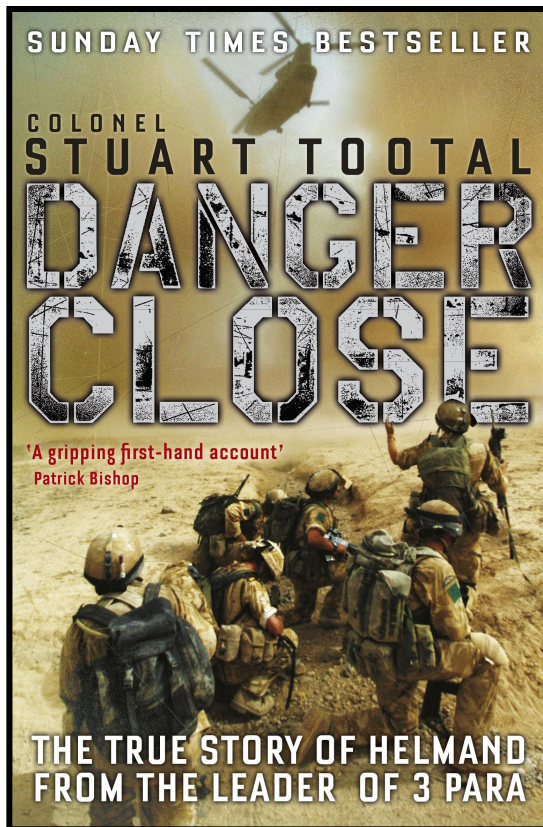

3 PARA was at the forefront of the war in Afghanistan – the first unit into the lawless province of Helmand. Colonel Stuart Tootal, who led the unit into battle, is the first senior commander to provide an account of the intense fighting.

The deployment was heralded as a peace mission. But the Taliban thought differently. The unit became engaged in a level of combat that has not been experienced by the British Army since the end of the Korean War. Undermanned, isolated and suffering from equipment shortages, 3 PARA fought doggedly against the Taliban. Through raw courage and determination, they won the break in battle for the British campaign.

Numerous gallantry decorations were awarded to the Battle Group, including the Victoria Cross, but they were not without the cost of many wounded and killed in action. On his return from Afghanistan, Tootal fought doggedly against an indifferent government to get proper treatment for his wounded.

Frustrated with the government's treatment of its soldiers, he resigned from the Army and is pursuing a career in corporate banking security. He has become one of the UK's foremost authorities on the situation in Afghanistan, and is regularly in the public eye. He is a trustee of the **3 PARA Afghan Trust** and remains active in raising funds for Armed Forces charities.
